Uganda in restoring the Amnesty Act in Uganda.

Amnesty Act was introduced in Uganda, as a moral imperative to open the way for the victims of

circumstances to be reintegrated into the communities where they first came from. It was

absolutely imperative for the 9th Parliament of Uganda to act wisely, as it did, to restore the

Amnesty Act in its entirety.

Thus, we are morally obliged to express our heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to all Members

of the 9th Parliament of Uganda for their wise decision-making skills in restoring the Amnesty

Act in Uganda. However, reinstatement of the Amnesty Act without Part II will be very much

problematic, especially to the population of Northern Uganda whose aspirations would be badly

wounded, if the matter is stalled.

We are, therefore, appealing to you to use your diplomatic influence to bear upon other Members of Parliament of Uganda to ensure that Part II of the Amnesty Act, which was lapsed by the Statutory Instrument of the Minister of Internal Affairs, is restored by Parliament of Uganda.
